- ❖ Bring the following to the Dunsmuir Community Building by 4:00 p.m. to set-up.
 - 8 quarts of your best chili in crock-pots, or pots on hot plates.
 - Two ladles to dish it up
 - An extension cord [12-25 feet long] and a power strip
 - A printed list of all the ingredients in your chili [Do not reveal amounts.]
- ❖ If you wish to bring additional condiments for your chili, please bring plenty.
- ❖ Railroad Committee will provide sampling cups, spoons, napkins, rolls and corn bread.
- ❖ Judging will be *People's Choice*.
- ❖ First, Second and Third Place awards for each category will be given at 7:00 p.m. First Place in each category receives \$50.
- ❖ Chili Cook-off contestants must submit this form to the Dunsmuir Railroad Days Committee no later than Thursday, January 30, 2019. Form may be mailed to: Dunsmuir Railroad Days Committee, P.O. Box 524, Dunsmuir, CA 96025-0524.

Dunsmuir Railroad Days Chili Cook-off Rules

Saturday, February 2, 2019

- 1. You may prepare your chili at the Dunsmuir Community Building. The facility will be open at 10 a.m. This facility is approved by the Siskiyou County Environmental Health Division. The Siskiyou County EHD is requiring fundraisers such as chili cook-offs and pie socials to meet all food preparation safety requirements.**
- 2. There will be refreshments available for the chefs.**
- 3. You may cook at an approved facility that provides sanitary conditions for the preparation and cooking of chili. Chili must be transported according to food safety regulations.**
- 4. Bring two crock-pots of chili = almost 8 quarts.**
- 5. Cook and serve your best chili recipe.**
- 6. Do not use store-bought chili. It must be your own recipe. No Dennison's or Campbell's.**
- 7. Bring a list of your ingredients. You do not need to give the amount of the ingredients used.**
- 8. Provide any special condiments for your chili. [Cheese, onions, salsa, etc.]**
- 9. You may begin to break down your chili booth at 7:15 p.m. or when all of your chili has been sampled.**
- 10. You are responsible for cleaning up your area, especially any spills on the floor.**
